"He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." — Micah 6:8 (NIV)

As we look to the future of First Christian Church Lincolnton, it's important to be rooted in what truly matters. We don't need to search far to discover God's vision for us—Micah 6:8 reminds us plainly what the Lord requires: *justice*, *mercy*, and *humble discipleship*. Humility doesn't mean thinking less of ourselves—it means thinking of ourselves less. To walk humbly with God is to stay teachable, to listen well, and to surrender control as we trust in God's guidance. As a congregation, we do not claim to have all the answers, but we walk forward in faith, seeking God's will together. We pray, worship, and serve with the understanding that it is Christ who leads this church—not any one person or plan. As we continue to grow as a community of faith, I believe God is calling First Christian Church Lincolnton to be a church that lives out Micah 6:8 in every aspect of our ministry. Not just in what we say, but in how we love. Not just in Sunday worship, but in weekday witness.

Let this verse be more than a motto. Let it be our mission.
